As specified in the 2020 Beach Plan drawn up by the Mijas Town Hall, the Mijas coast now has 65 sanitising gel dispensers installed along the different beaches, in addition to the 34 installed in the toilets that are distributed along the coastline, reaching almost a hundred dispensers, a measure that seeks to guarantee the hygiene of bathers who visit the Mijas coasts and thus prevent COVID-19 infections.

In addition, during these days a total of 25 information panels have been installed along the coast with recommendations for the safe use of the beaches. "Excellence in safety is what will differentiate us from other destinations and will give us that status that guarantees the health of users on our beaches. In Mijas, we have put all our efforts into this and we have achieved our objective. Not in vain, we already boast the seal of 'Andalucía Segura', (Safe Andalusia) being the first

coastline of Malaga to obtain it", assured the councillor for Beaches, **José Carlos Martín** (C's).

Thanks to these 65 sanitising gel dispensers, users who come to the beaches will be able to clean their hands both on arrival and leaving. "Hygiene is one of the main factors against the virus, as is the safety distance, and both are complied with on the coast of Mijas", said Martín, adding that "the dispensers are integrated into a structure that has a wastebasket attached to throw away the masks and gloves".

In addition to the access points, "two hydroalcohol gel dispensers have been installed in each of the 17

SAFE BEACHES

A HUNDRED DISPENSERS INSTALLED ALONG THE COAST

According to the Department for Beaches, two main factors are in place to prevent COVID-19 infection on the Mijas coast: safety distances and hygiene. To guarantee this last premise, bathers can disinfect their hands both at the entrance and at the exit of the beaches thanks to the gel dispensers that have been installed, and which are also available in the toilets.

▶ **65 DISPENSERS** at the entrance and exit to the beaches

▶ **34 DISPENSERS** located in the 17 toilets along the coast

toilets on the Mijas beaches, along with traditional soap so that each user can use whatever they prefer". These 34 gel dispensers are to be added to the 65 located on the beach and raise the figure to a hundred of

these devices that are aimed at reinforcing hygiene measures. On the other hand, the councillor pointed out that "the 25 posters that collect all the information on security and prevention measures against CO-

VID-19, as well as the rules for the use of beaches and toilets, have now been put up".

As well as these posters, all the vertical and horizontal signage has been installed, indicating the safety

HYGIENE & SAFETY

The dispensers have a built-in waste bin in order to be able to deposit gloves and masks. They also show instructions on how to wash hands, both with soap and water and with sanitising gel.

NOW INSTALLED ARE

▶ **25 INFORMATIVE SIGNS** with the rules for the correct use of the beaches

This informative signage is to be added to both horizontal and vertical signs to maintain the safety distance of two metres between people.

distance of two metres to be respected between bathers, a distance that is controlled by drones in the air and on the beaches themselves with the 34 capacity controllers that are part of this year's safety device.
